


WELCOME



Southern 5 Sewer District Informational

Meeting Notes August 20, 2023

Tom Secor was introduced by Eric Griffin and given an hour to address and field questions from the HL board and 51 signed in members present. The Southern 5 Sewer District is a municipal entity composed of appointed representatives from each of the 4 involved townships and the City of Willard. They have been meeting twice monthly and are being advised by attorney John Albers out of Columbus. The board consists of:

Norwich Twp Dick Wiles Greenfield Twp Tom Secor New Haven Mike Buurma Richmond Ed Weirs Willard Alan Babcock This board is working diligently and has just hired an engineering firm to design and plan for this system.

The anticipated time line for the engineering and planning stage is 12-18 months with another 12-18 months for actual construction phase. This is a rough estimate on a time line, obviously with hopes to be on the shorter end. The Southern 5 Sewer Board has applied for a \$1,478,462.00 loan for the planning and engineering of our HOLIDAY LAKES Sewer System. (Celeryville will have its own planning/engineering and construction plans. These are the ONLY 2 systems being planned by the Southern 5 Sewer District right now). This loan will roll over into a construction loan in approximately 2 years. Until then this loan requires a \$78.00/yr. assessment to be collected from EACH lot (1348 plotted lots) in Holiday Lakes. The funds collected from this assessment will apply to future costs. Billing for this assessment will be done by the Southern 5 Sewer Board and will begin October 2023. The construction loan may be repaid over 30-40 years and will include a combination of extremely low interest and principal forgiveness loans. ***Our project is too late for any ARPA funds, but there is still a significant amount of funding available from the State of Ohio. *** Details and specifics are still being worked out by the sewer board and the engineering firm (Jones & Henry).

There are many questions that simply can't be answered at this time. Ideally, the construction loan would include everything from the individual grinder pumps to the City of Willard POTW (publicly owned treatment works). Hook Ups to the grinders and decommissioning of our current septic systems MAY be included, but this is not guaranteed. Homeowners will be responsible for getting power to their grinder pumps, but specific requirements will need to be determined. The bottom line is there are still a LOT of questions out there. Tom Secor has agreed to keep us informed and has volunteered to hold additional informational meetings in the future

Monthly Membership Meeting August 17, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Eric Griffin at 7:00 with 10 members signed in.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and roll call was taken with all directors present.

President's Report: Eric Griffin Anni Goodsite was introduced as our new office manager. Anni brings great organizational skills and a wealth of knowledge to our office. She is a long-time member, past board member and an active volunteer. Eric announced that Chris Pheiffer and Henry Jarrett have swapped board positions to play better to each of their strengths. Chris P is now the Vice President and Henry is now the Treasurer. Eric reiterated the proper procedure for filing a complaint is to fill out a complaint form. Although the form requires a signature, the "offender" will be notified via the Holiday Lakes office and board. The person filing the complaint will not be disclosed. The only way things will be rectified is by officially filling out a complaint form. Calling the office or a board member will not get the issue solved (UNLESS it is a flagrant safety or health issue.) The board is working on forming a few small committees that will be able to advise the board in several areas. Things such as a finance committee, a rules and regulations committee, a grant committee.... Please watch for more information as we develop these committees and if you have some expertise in a certain area, we urge you to VOLUNTEER your time and talent to help our association. Looking into a system to "blast" emails out to all members much as Survey Monkey did with the community survey last spring. Anni will be working to find the best fit for our needs.

<u>Vice President's Report: Chris Pheiffer</u> Chris P gave an update on the key fobs and how user friendly they are. 1 time cost of \$15/device. Regular fobs STILL work, this is just a convenience You DO NOT have to purchase this APP. The office can get you all set up if desired. Reported that the maintenance building construction is about complete. We will do a final walkthrough with Josh and the Architectural Committee with many eyes making sure everything is complete to our satisfaction, before signing off and paying the contractor the balance due. We will still have to wait for the holding tank installation before the Certificate of Occupancy can be issued. After all that is in place, we plan to have a community open house for all to see our new building.

Treasurer's Report: Henry Jarrett Henry gave a brief overview of the books. He indicated that there have been issues with PAYHOA and the way things have or have not been entered. He is working closely with our accounting firm to get things sorted out and posted properly. The money is all accounted for, it is just not posted to the correct ledger accounts in some cases. Thinking there may be a better solution to help members with online payments/info out there. The first of the 5 year \$200 assessments (due July 31, 2023) have still been coming in. Henry has created accounts to track this money that is specifically designated for capital items. He has set up with our accounting firm to have accounts reconciled monthly. He also has been working with a company to upgrade our office computer and increase the storage and back up capabilities. Henry also gave a quick overview of the financials from Lake Fest. We are still waiting on a couple invoices, but all told, Lake Fest was very successful financially.

<u>Director's Report: Chris Hassmann</u> Chris reminded all that there will be an informational South 5 Sewer District meeting for all interested Holiday Lake members, here at the lodge this Sunday (August 20) at 1pm. Tom Secor and some of the other sewer district board members will be present to give us an overview of where we stand in this process, and what will be expected from each property owner as we proceed with this project. We hope that it is well attended and some of our questions can be answered.

Secretary's Report: Lynda Snyder Lake Fest was a huge success, thanks to our generous sponsors and ALL our volunteers. Thank You's have been sent to all our generous sponsors. Next year's planning will begin with a meeting on Wednesday Nov 8 at 7pm. Pancake breakfast coming up Labor Day Saturday Sept 2 with serving from 8-11. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AND WELCOMED!! Show up at 7:30 am or contact a member of the Social Committee. Annual Duck Race will be held on Labor Day Sunday starting with the kids' Race at 4pm. Duck sales are NOW. Forms are available at the office, on Next Door and will be in the Beacon and will be available at the Pancake Breakfast and the Day of the Duck Race. This was a huge fundraiser for our lake last year and enabled us to help with the main beach bathroom remodel and enlarging the pontoon parking areas on the beach. Please contact Joe Wiles 567-224-1332 for additional information. None of these events happen without VOLUNTEERS. Many hands lighten the load and it's a great way to meet your neighbors and come together for a common goal. Please consider helping out at some of our events. Many volunteers have also helped with the refurbishing of our lodge and meeting room. Many have donated time helping with parts of the new maintenance building construction. Our website is being updated by a member willing to help out. Please, please consider giving some of your time and or talents to help make our lake all that it can be! 2023 Lake Fest T shirts are still available and are on sale in the office, at the pancake breakfast and at the duck race. Welcome Committee will be giving an update, but since 2019 over 125 new members have been welcomed to our lake community

<u>Welcome Committee:</u> Barb Harper reported that The Welcome Committee had a bit of a slow start this year with the Rules and Regulations Handbook being reconfigured and cleaned up. New 2023 members are being welcomed. The committee has been working on a new Holiday Lakes Member Directory; however, it has been discovered that many files in our PAYHOA and Sage Systems - where the information was pulled – do not match up. The directory will not be published until most of these kinks have been worked out.

<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> Paul Z 1321 Asked if our insurance covered Builder's Risk during the construction of our maintenance build. We are insured with member Jay Langhurst through Cincinnati Insurance and recently updated and increased coverage and our umbrella policy and yes, builder's risk is part of all that.

Chris H mentioned that unsafe boating practices are being witnessed on the lake often. Please if you see someone doing something unsafe or against our boating rules (most of which are actually ODNR laws) tactfully say something. With so many new members, many are unfamiliar with our boating laws. There are ODNR safe boating booklets available at the lodge as well as our boating rules and regulations in our handbook. Chris P Highlighted the fact that due to some of the most abused boating violations maybe a class or signing an attestation should be required in the future before stickers are issued ????

Paul Z 1321 wanted it known that the west side of the causeway is in dire need of stone. It is on the agenda for stone this fall.

NEW BUSINESS: Rose Ann V 943 indicated she had ODNR booklets and handouts available with fishing and boating information. These are on a table in the lodge for anyone interested.

Barb H 912 Asked about a beach rule sign to be placed where boaters can see, as there have been several instances with dogs at the beach. The owners claim they were unaware of the NO dogs on the beach rule. Also, no dogs are allowed on the patio at the Brass Pelican. Barb H 912 Inquired about the possibility of an area where dogs could enter into the lake. We will try to figure out if this is a possibility.

Kelley G 750 Asked about swimming pools that are now "terrariums" with all the trees and vegetation growing out of them, and some smell horrible. Some of these were identified with our drive arounds, but if you see or know of some unsightly areas, please file a complaint.

(Any structure permanent or semi-permanent that creates an appurtenance in the lake.) No permit required for the following: Roof, Siding, Window/Door replacement. Members will be assessed a \$500 fine if found doing construction on any of the above projects without applying for and obtaining a construction permit and/or posting a performance bond prior to any work being done. Failure to do so will result in a \$200 per month fine assessed to the property owner until all construction has been terminated, removed, and restored. All work must comply with dimensions and set backs of Holiday Lakes Building and R.C.O. Codes. If more than one line item is to be performed at the same time, each permit fee applies. The only exception is a New Home Permit, which includes septic, culvert, and drive. No combining multiple jobs into one permit. If work is started without applying for and receiving permit with approved plans, the permit fee will be doubled, plus \$500 fine. MEMBERS SHOULD CALL TO SEE IF A PERMIT IS NEEDED. 419-935-0238. PLEASE SUBMITA SITE PLAN WITH EACH PERMIT REQUEST. New Homes, Additions, Detached Garages: Township zoning permit needed in addition. SUBMIT ROAD BOND FOR \$250 FOR ANY HEAVY EQUIPMENT THAT WILL CROSS HL ROADS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF ANY KIND.

Be a Safe Pedestrian and Driver

With spring here, we're seeing more and more people out walking in Holiday Lakes.

The increased presence of pedestrians we see this time of year also means more opportunities for accidents.

Safe driving on the road and cautious walking might seem to be common sense. But pedestrian accident statistics demonstrate that often, common sense is lacking or ignored by both drivers and pedestrians. Here are ten reminders to heed when you are driving your car or walking on the road to help keep pedestrians safe.

Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- If a walking path is not provided, always walk as far on the shoulder of the road as possible
 and walk facing traffic.
- If walking at night or in dark conditions, carry a flashlight and wear reflective clothing, such
 as a reflective vest or coat with reflective markings.
- Always cross the street at an intersection. Be especially mindful for cars turning left or right
 at intersections.
- Avoid distractions. Avoid any distractions when walking on or near the road or crossing the street. Using cell phones, electronic devices, ear buds, or headphones is a distraction. Having anything in or over your ears can limit your senses and provide a distraction. Do not drink and walk. Avoid walking if you have consumed drugs or alcohol. Even a small amount may impair your judgement, reaction time, and coordination.

Safety Tips for Drivers

- As a driver, your legal responsibility to other drivers extends to pedestrians. Always: follow
 the rules of the road, exercise caution, avoid distractions, be alert for safety signs and signals
 and yield to pedestrians at intersections, crosswalks, parking lots, and driveways.
- Always use extra caution when driving in poor conditions, such as bad weather, poorly lit
 areas, and simple nighttime driving, all of which can make it difficult to spot pedestrians.
- Always obey the speed limit, especially in areas near crosswalks and intersections. Reduce your speed when approaching intersections or crosswalks and be prepared to stop if necessary.
- A stopped vehicle is stopped for a reason. Another driver may see pedestrians crossing the road or children playing in the area that you cannot see.
- · Never drive under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Period.
- Avoid distractions. Using cell phones, is illegal and a distraction.
